The three of them find out rather quickly that getting to the cartel's hideout was easy - Escaping will be a whole different ballgame.

Having not read any of the rest of the books in Carolyn McCray's Betrayed series, I found Ambush to be a pretty premise. The dialogue was smooth and conversational and the characters were likable. I loved Cpl. Lopez and his first choice of transportation. I found the small interjections of humor that break up the serious overtones to be a great addition to the book.
