It was a mistake reading *Craving Hawk* without reading the preceding volumes in Nicole Jacquelyn's solid *Aces* biker series. I had read the first three books, which deal with the previous generation, but I stopped at Poet's book because it did not work for me at all. I think there have been several more books after that, dealing with the younger generation of *Aces* but my heart wasn't in it anymore. The result was that I didn't know half of the people mentioned casually throughout *Hawk* nor was I familiar with the numerous, unresolved plotlines that had been obviously pending from several volumes back.

Having said all that, I still managed to enjoy *Hawk*. Jacquelyn is a writer who can invoke deep emotions in the reader without resorting to cheesy, play-the-violin, theatrics. Her writing is crisp and clear, devoid of sentimentality and yet able to be poignant. The characters and setting felt extremely authentic of the socio-economic status of the characters without resorting to cliche caricature or mimicking Kristen Ashley.

I actually connected more with the family drama portion of the book than the insta-love relationship between the two protagonists. Especially poignant was the point made that as parents, we always hammer into our daughters' mind to be weary of predators but we don't equip our sons with those same skills and in a reverse-sexist way, we just assume that they will be man enough to handle any predators, which puts them in a vulnerable and dangerous position. That same macho attitude makes it less likely that they will go to someone for help when something heinous does happen. The shame and self-blaming is just as relevant for boys who have been the victim of sexual assault as it is for girls, and that is a lesson well worth reiterating.

Onto the romance front, well, as I said, things didn't quite work for me. I feel like I missed the entire part

where these two are supposed to fall in love. One second they were trading insults and the next, falling into bed and saying I love you. To borrow from biker romance speak, I just ain't feelin'it.

To top it all off, the ending was quite abrupt and ambivalent. I am sure there will be following volumes where we will see more of that couple but it still felt like a cop-out. How a couple can reconstruct something from the ashes of a relationship could make for a deep and meaty story. I know Jacquelyn is capable of it because she put out not one, but three, solid tales (the first three in the series) where the couples had to surmount incredible obstacles before forging a solid and committed relationship. Maybe she is just too exhausted to go through another emotional journey like that. Maybe she will follow it up in another volume. I, for one, am not sure if I am invested enough to continue with the Aces.
