I'm not sure what's wrong with me that I'm not fawning all over after reading a Catherine Mann novel. Everyone else is loving these, not even just really liking. They are *loving* them. Again, this one is okay but nothing special. A simple enough story with all the necessary tangles. It's #2 in the series (I didn't read #1) and tells the story of Duarte Medina, middle son of deposed King of San Rinaldo, Enrique Medina. After his wife's murder, Enrique Medina relocates his boys to a private island off St. Augustine, FL. The boys are raised in isolation for their own safety and it's not until adulthood that the three Princes are able to leave and pursue their own lives. Each one hides out in his own way. Duarte purchases and lives in his hotels. He speaks to his brothers occasionally but lives estranged from his father. His father's health is rapidly failing and he's requested that Duarte come home for 30 days to settle some matters. Duarte catches photojournalist Kate Harper scaling the walls of his balcony and recognizes her as the reporter who recently revealed the Medina Princes' identities to the public. He decides he can use Kate to appease his father by pretending they are engaged -in exchange for him not pressing charges against her forced entry- and he can exact revenge on her exposé. Whatever Kate did to expose the Medina Princes was in book #1, and it's left the whole family vulnerable and raw. So this is how it all begins. We meet Duarte's brother Tony and his fiancée Shannon (and her 3 yr old son Kolby from book #1). We also meet Enrique, Kate's special-needs adult sister Jennifer and briefly we glimpse the eldest Medina son Carlos, who was severely wounded during his mother's murder (he's the focus of book #3).

There's a good bit of elaborateness to the plot. It's also an old fashioned, perhaps even most every little girls dream come true scenario: A gorgeous, rich, (some even like them) damaged, real-life prince sweeps a normal, everyday girl off her feet. It's whirlwind and contrived but that doesn't stop the magic of it all. Both Kate and Duarte are likeable and kind to one another. They have a sassy relationship but not much depth. It's 186 pages so I'm not complaining. It was just so-so most of the time. Nothing to hate here but nothing to adore either.

I look forward to a non-Harlequin Catherine Mann read soon.
