Of this life, she writes with clarity and memory. We hear of the events that lead her to the lifestyle, and we hear of the lifestyle itself, in no uncertain terms.

This is a wonderful book, and it takes a side of life that is regarded as seedy and destructive, and makes it an open book. No excuses; no justification; just life as it was for the author.

I know how hard it is to write of such personal things. How confronting and how dangerous to put your self out there for the world to judge. Ms Cleeve has done an admirable job.
