This is a tedious book based on a tantalizing premise. Hot triplet alien princes share a mate and that mate is a quasi-human named Lariah. Plus she's submissive. That should be sexy. Right?

The reality isn't as pretty. The writing is in a detached and overly simplistic manner, a little like reading a user manual. I have to give the author credit for having thoroughly realized the entire fantasy world and all of its customs, but she did not have to present it in the form of a lesson in nearly every chapter as things are explained to the point of exhaustion while the only interaction (beyond the sermon) is Lariah interrupting with questions which the men oh-so-patiently answer.

The sex is similarly described. Excessive detail in physical acts while the characters' only feelings are stunted in depth. For each scene you will know exactly where the three men are positioned and where their hands are located and what they are doing with each limb. Yet their emotions are either not described at all, or are simple and uninteresting. Nor is it D/s in my opinion. There are a few suggestions which Lariah is happy to agree to without hesitation. If dominance is just telling a woman to go down on you then ... well, that's basic. That's SEX101 in the context of "dirty talk" and expressing your desires. The closest we get to a hint of D/s is the pedantic explanation by the brothers that they seek a submissive mate.

Kudos to the author for making a delineation between D/s in a sexual context versus being overbearing (or abusive) in the relationship. The men are respectful and clear when they explain ad nauseam that dominance is just for the bedroom and does not carry over to their actions in the relationship, nor does it mean that the

submissive is weak. Etc. Essentially the author covers every erroneous stereotype about BDSM. Really this book reads like a primer on kink and deep throating. Yes, we even get a lengthy step-by-step lesson for how Lariah is to safely deep throat long and girthy alien cocks!
