In "Chasing Marisol" the third book in the "Blueprint for Love" series which I won through Goodreads Giveaways, sexual fireworks explode when Jefferson Traynor a sexy partner in Specialty Construction who gets roped into building an extension to " The New Beginnings" women's shelter meets Marisol Ortega the key fundraiser for the project. When confronted by the charming, arrogant builder Marisol Ortega, a woman haunted by abuse in her past who's raising a sweet five year old plagued by the selfish manipulation of a drug

addicted mother has no time for a sexual games or the man who persists in pursuing her. Yet as Jeff manages the building project and they get to know each other their chemistry ignites , each becoming vulnerable as they let down their defenses and fall in love.

Lauren Giordano sets the stage for a touching love story at a women's shelter where Jeff Traynor and his company have been hired to build an extension. Disgruntled at having to manage his father's charity project Jeff 's interest is quickly sparked by the beautiful and smart Marisol Ortega, a single foster mother who's in charge of coordinating the funding. When they meet sparks fly although both have been shattered by events in their past, and Marisol is still dealing with a drug-addicted mother who refuses to give up her rights to five year old Hector, the young boy she's been fostering.

In an emotionally -charged story Jeff who likes fun and no commitment in his relationships suddenly finds himself attracted to a woman with secrets in her past, who's immune to his sexual charm. In a plot that points out the destructiveness of an overloaded and ineffective legal system and the fragility and violence of life at a women's shelter, love wins the day as Jeff not only grows to admire the workers and women at "New Beginnings" but quickly loses his heart to Marisol and her amazing little boy. Tension escalates not only when a drunken ex-husband attacks Marisol at the shelter, but when Hector is discovered missing from his school bus. Amid all the trouble and turmoil as events unfold that move quickly and smoothly to a heart-warming conclusion, humorous and poignant moments lighten the suspense especially when Hector looks to Jeff for manly advice.

Bringing realism, depth and passion to this touching page-turner that you can't put down until the end, the author has created unforgettable and complex characters who have faced heartbreak in their past yet find love together. Marisol (Mari) Ortega a sassy and tough administrator at the shelter has no room for romance in her life after the abusive treatment of an ex-boyfriend. Her heart belongs to the sweet and loving five year old who she's been trying to adopt. Single-minded and stubborn she refuses at first to succumb to Jeff's charm putting all her energy into her pet project. Jefferson Traynor a good-looking, self-indulgent player who has no trouble attracting women is drawn not only to the sensible, kind and giving single mom, but also to her little boy who wants to help him dig the foundation of the new extension. Uneasy with commitment he's challenged by the secretive woman who he quickly comes to love and admire.

Among a cast of memorable characters who heighten the drama of the story are Jeff's dad Linc Traynor a workaholic father who nearly lost the family he loves; Pete Shea an intimidating former military soldier who's a protective guardian at the home; Hank Freeman the blunt, cranky but practical project foreman; and Anne an abused, hardworking mother who finds love at the shelter.

First of all was how many people are impacted by one abusive relationship. The helplessness that so many people feel both men and women who are affected by the abuse someone they know and love has been subjected too. It was very hard for Jeff to know exactly how to react to the situation. To want to go and find the person abusing his loved one and tear him apart but having to swallow that and try to figure how to offer the kind of support that Mari needed. And for Mari's family wanting to protect their daughter. Because no matter how old a son and/or daughter get, to a loving Mother and loving Father you are always their little one and the desire to protect is overwhelming. Another thing that came out in the story is how long it can take for someone to get over the damaging impact of an abusive relationship after it has finally ended. Also how overwhelming the impact is. There is Annie and she is all but imprisoned in that facility because leaving would put herself and her children at risk. She barely has a life she can't do anything except what she is allowed to do within the four walls of the facility. She can't even pursue her profession as a nurse. And it seems to go on forever. An excellent, well thought out book, Chasing Marisol draws the reader into the story from the very first page. Jefferson's manipulative father has inveigled Jeff into taking over the improvements to the women's shelter New Beginnings recognising that Marisol, the single minded director of the project, will challenge Jeff at every level. Playboy Jeff quickly realises that he has bitten off more than he can chew when he starts to prowl after Marisol, but her resistance towards him only peaks his interest. For the first time, in his quest to win her over, Jeff really begins to know and understand Marisol. In doing so his eyes are opened regarding the work the staff are doing at the centre, and the challenges they and the women they are protecting face on a daily basis.
