It's truly hard to decide what I like most about Stray Affections by Charlene Ann Baumbich. Her writing

The story centers on Cassandra Higgins who is doing life, but not really living it. She sacrificed her dreams a long time ago. She felt that she didn't deserve them anymore.

Cassandra's life begins to take a wild and crazy turn when she purchases a snowglobe at a collector's convention. Cassandra is a young mother of 4 little boys, the oldest one 6 years old. She is busy beyond words and Baumbich really portrayed her character well. As I laughed at all the antics and shenanigans 4 little boys and a big boy husband can create, I also remembered my own parenting days when those same or similar antics and shenanigans were so not funny.

While Cassandra loves her life, she always loved animals as a child and had dreams of becoming a veterinarian, her grandfather encouraging her and going so far as to help her hide a stray rescue dog that Cassandra was determined to care for and claim as her own. Those are fond and painful memories for her because her mother, widowed with two older boys and Cassandra to care for while working in a local factory, actually took Cassandra's dreams from her.
