The Long Con from the blurb sounded like a delightfully wicked novel with Agent Bradley pulling an undercover job on a very dangerous criminal. Unfortunately, the novel became so convoluted with whom was conning whom that it lost some of its charm and mystery, as I kept trying to keep track of who was the good guy and who was the bad guy.

Nathaniel Bradley is an agent with a organized task force in England. When his step-grandmother's priceless Faberge egg is stolen, he makes it his mission to recover it even if that means going to New York and posing as a prostitute for a gang of con artists who think they are selling a fake Faberge egg to known mobster, Anthony "Tony" Terranova. Bradley is the bait to lure Tony into their scheme, but both men have other secrets, ones that could place everyone in danger.

I love a good undercover sting operation in a book and was hoping that Agent Bradley seducing Mafia guy Tony would be interesting. I think if that had just been the plot it could have worked, but when you threw in the gang of con artists, who didn't even know they had a real Faberge egg in their hands, the plot fell apart. Plus, who in their right mind would try and con a Mafia Don's son out of eight million dollars? That just did not make sense and could easily get you a pair of cement shoes. Add in Tony's secret job, his ex-girlfriend, the BDSM overtones – which did not work in this storyline in my estimation – and finally the Insta-Love connection and it seemed like every trope in a romance novel but the kitchen sink was used, and not very well.

I really wish I could recommend this book as I love a good episode of Leverage or Remington Steele, but The Long Con was a huge disappointment all around.

I went on an interesting journey with this book. I started out hating it. The writing is on the simple side and is just flat out bad at times so when the book began I immediately wanted to put it down. I thought to myself,

"okay, just stick with it, I'm sure things will improve." When Bradley and Tony first meet there was a very strange leap out of nowhere into BDSM that just didn't work for me... but I decided to forge ahead. And honestly, I'm glad that I did.

The main issue with this book is the make-no-sense plot. It was muddled and unnecessarily confusing. Everyone is pretending to be someone that they aren't, and while a killer author can pull that off, Lori Toland isn't quite there. It was so confusing that I just decided to ignore the plot altogether. Also, another annoying aspect for me was the over the top insta-love. It just veered straight into sappy too fast and too hard for my liking (odd for a BDSM book but still). In the end, I just read this book for the chemistry between the main characters. And that leads me to the highlight of the book: The chemistry. Bradley and Tony were very very hot together and though I am SICK of BDSM books, in this book, I'll admit that it worked. It added to the story rather than detracted from it. The sex was delicious and kinky. I'd like to say that this book benefited from the Abigail Roux effect: The plot is nonsensical at times but the chemistry between the two men pull it off.

Why still such a low rating? Well, I can't get over how difficult it was for me to wade through the plot. Frustratingly, the author could have easily simplified it and eliminated so many issues. Also, I honestly didn't altogether enjoy the reading experience. I would give this author another go though because I think she writes a mean sex scene.

The Long Con had smut, and I love smut. I liked its BDSM-lightness, meaning there was one BDSM-y sex scene. I liked the dirty talk; it's a small shame there wasn't more of it. I liked how insatiable of a bottom Tony was and how eager Nate was to satisfy Tony. On top of the yummy smut, the book actually had a decent plot and a good twist so it wasn't just a PWP. I should have been a happy camper, but I wasn't. I couldn't bring myself to fully enjoy the story, and I felt annoyingly nitpicky.

When it comes to smut, I can tolerate insta-love a great deal, a very great deal. However, I couldn't tolerate it in this book. I was okay with the fact that the couple lusted for each other on first sight. Nothing about that was unrealistic. I was not okay with how that lust magically developed into love, and it bugged me.

My issue was that the couple got too intimate too quickly to be believable considering who they were, especially who they were. Nate was an undercover agent, one that is on an unofficial international mission. Tony was a Mafia kid, and not just any kid but the heir to a major Mafia family. They should have been on their guard. Instead, they slept together overnight and ended up cohabiting for the length of Nate's mission.

During the cohabitation period, neither of them was carrying a gun or throwing looks of suspicion at each other or anything that openly suggested distrust. They acted more like they were a regular, lovey-dovey couple instead of the dangerous, suspicious people that they were supposed to be. The insta-love brought on an unnatural level of trust between the couple, which made the romance surreal.

I expected a high level of anxiety as both try to come to term with their love against who they were and what they were supposed to be doing; I didn't get that. Don't get me wrong; I don't want angst. I just thought the characters were not believable in their role. Because of that, piling on the emotions being rather subdued, I couldn't connect to the romance.

In Conclusion

I rate *The Long Con* 2-stars for it was okay. Trust was a theme in this book, and it was not properly played. The issue eclipsed the smut. Ay. I want to slap my brain.

For what it's worth, I liked the twist about Tony. I think it would have been a better story if it was told from

his POV instead of exclusively from Nate's 1st person POV. Nate wasn't boring per se; Tony was just way more interesting.

I won this from The Sweet Spot monthly contest and Ms. Toland was very sweet and prompt in getting me the e-book. I am sorry to say that this one just didn't work for me.

The concept was great but I think this book needs a good editor. I often found myself confused about what was going on and who was involved. Plus the con was hardly part of the story; it would come and go from the book, not a good thing for a book called The Long Con.

The connection (insta-love) between the MCs was too quick and not well explained. Things were often repeated for no apparent reason. There were too many different storylines and they never meshed up with each other in a reasonable way. For example, I never understood why Bradley was thought to be a prostitute; he was English but seldom used English terms; and he had to find this Faberge egg for his "grandmother" (quotes because it was pointed out a lot that she wasn't his blood relative) but then suddenly at the end it was pointed out he disliked his grandfather, his main connection to his grandmother. Tony was supposedly from a crime family but that never rang true either but he had crazy money. And this drove me nuts, they went to get a suit made for Bradley, supposedly from the Spring line of a designer, I forget who. The pants were finished! I don't buy my husband suits from designers often but we've bought enough suits from regular stores to KNOW that the pants are never finished, they have to be hemmed. That is the kind of thing that makes me nuts because it's so very easy to find out. And any time the story started going somewhere everything stopped so they could have sex, it was just odd. And I hate to say it but the sex was just as disjointed as the rest of the book. I finally just started skimming toward the end because I wanted to move on.

I do think this book has potential but it needs more work.

The only thing taken in the robbery was one of the lost Faberge eggs so it is thought to be an art theft. Bradley travels to the U.S. and infiltrates a ring of con men by posing as a hustler. The con is supposed to be an easy one with Bradley seducing the heir apparent of a mafia family, Tony Terranova, while the others sell Tony what they believe to be a phony Faberge egg. The seduction goes off beautifully and Bradley is firmly ensconced in Tony's apartment. What Bradley doesn't count on is that Tony is the perfect Sub to compliment Bradley's Dom needs. His search takes him to New York where he is recruited by a con team to play the lure in an elaborate sting to sell a fake Faberge egg, which is in fact the real egg. The mark is the very dangerous Anthony Terranova the son of a mafia boss... only Bradley is not prepared for how gorgeous the man is and just how much his body is craving the sub he see's hidden behind those blue eyes, dark with lust.

There is a plot which revolves around Bradley infiltrating the gang and getting his hands on the stolen egg he is desperate to return his Grandmother but this is more about the relationship between the two MC's and Bradleys conflicting emotions, Tony was a murder, a killer and the son of a mafia boss... yet his gut was telling him different! There is a lot of very hot, panty melting D/s play and with Bradley being a Dom his body is crying out to do all kinds of naughty's with Tony, who as a sub can't get enough! This first quarter of this book was very confusing for me. I really had to concentrate on following who was who, who was conning who, and what the cons all even were. Everyone seemed to be conning someone else, and even the conmen were being conned. I decided to not worry about it and just wait for things to become clearer later on, which they pretty much did.

Everything centers around this Faberge Egg, which belonged to but was stolen from Nathaniel Bradley's aunt. Nathaniel is a UK citizen who normally works with a unit that takes down organized crime in the UK. He has become involved with the egg retrieval in the US by becoming one of the conmen involved in conning Anthony Terranova, son of a Mafia crime boss, who it seems is attempting to buy the stolen egg.

Nathaniel (conname Bradley) and Tony hit it off, and Bradley strays from the original con plan to serve his own agenda, which is the egg retrieval. These two are smoking hot together. I had a bit of a hard time picturing a hard ass Mafia guy as the super sexy sweet submissive Tony, but he ends up having a bit of a split personality where the tough guy is concerned. There isn't anything too hardcore here, but the d/s that quickly comes into play is hot stuff.

I was a bit disappointed in the instalove that happens over a matter of a few days and a lot of sex, especially knowing everyone is lying to everyone else. There are a few twists and turns, but nothing earthshattering or overly shocking. I did enjoy this in the end, but I believe most of that comes from the chemistry between Tony and Bradley than the confusing and somewhat unbelievable con plot.
