The perfect ending for one of the most stunning series I have ever read. Full review to follow

This series holds a special place in my heart, which is why it has taken me so long to write my review for 'After the Rain', the last book in the Rain Series. In some ways I didn't want to let go of the story and kept holding on to it unable to put into words how much this story spoke to me.⁷

Kas and Raina's story was one that has really made a change to my life and the way I view the world. Having suffered from severe depression for the last two years, I had lost faith in the world, and at times humanity, but Raina's amazing growth throughout this trilogy gave me hope for myself. Raina's strength in the face of adversity spoke to me, and showed that if someone loves you, they will be there for you always, and will never hurt you. The man that Kas became throughout his relationship with Raina was beautiful to witness, his protectiveness, his pure love, his devotion, everything just had me wishing for my own Kas. I just loved the utter devotion between the two of them, and never once did I fear that they wouldn't make it, I loved having such certainty in their love that I didn't fear that their relationship would turn sour. It was truly amazing, and I still tear up when I think of their loving, supportive and flirty relationship, and when I think of the strong, independent woman that Raina by the strength of Kas' love.

The forensic aspect of this story was put together just as brilliantly as in the last two books. Book two ended on a cliffhanger that had me almost pulling my hair out, and I moved onto book three in a second, on the edge of my seat. Karen-Anne Stewart has an amazing writing style that just draws me in and completely consumes me. When I was reading these books, I lost all track of time, and when I had to go to work, my mind was still lost in Kas and Raina's world, thinking about the characters, the riddles that they faced in their investigation of 'The Ghost', and a nervous excitement at the amazing story I knew was to come.

The investigations that the police department were working on were written to perfection, with just the right amount of mystery, and the answers being given to the reader in little bites throughout the book, and not dumped on the reader at the end where it can sometimes seem like an information overload. Everything was explained so subtly, yet clearly that I had no trouble following the thrilling storyline, and didn't once feel that there were too many elements to the case. Sometimes with these sorts of stories, so many connections are risen, and I struggle to see how they all fit, but Karen-Anne Stewart balanced this perfectly.

This story is just utter perfection, and I know that this will definitely be one of my 're-read every year' series.

I received a copy of After the Rain in exchange for an honest review.

I give After the Rain 4 stars.

I must begin by saying that I patiently (NOT!) waited for the final installment of the Saving Rain Trilogy. I counted down the days until I could get my hands on a copy of AtR. I specifically remember going through this weird funk right before receiving my ARC. Nothing I read satisfied my reading hunger. Until the wonderful and awesome Karen-Ann Stewart sent me a copy. Thank you Karen-Ann!

So, After the Rain picks up where Healing Rain left off which is good because I very much dislike picking up a book and feeling like I've missed something at the very beginning of it. Action seeped from the book from the start and although the book focused more on Kas and his internal conflicts on how to keep his wife safe, we still get a fair share of Raina and her struggles even though not as imperative as books one and two. Kas' over protectiveness of Raina turns into control and is somewhat over-bearing. There were several times in the book where I wanted to slap some sense into him and then I remembered that the thought of living in a world where a loved one doesn't exist, often times, leads one to think and do irrational things. Thankfully, he has his good friend, Chase, snap him out of it. Chase. Chase is a sweetheart. Throughout the whole series he has been such great support to both Kas and Raina. I also admire his unbiasedness. He lets Kas know when he is in the wrong even if it's something Kas does not want to hear.

Raina is SO bad-ass in this book! She is a fighter and that is something that we've seen throughout the whole series. What transpires in the beginning of After the Rain only solidifies that. In fact, we see just how bad-ass she is throughout the whole book. She turns into this headstrong super woman and I am so happy to see that after all she's been through.

We run across several surprises in AtR. Some good and some not so good. Some humorous and some

saddening. Several characters were seriously hurt (some even killed) and although tears were shed, Karen-Ann Stewart did an impeccable job at keeping the emotions balanced. "Change of plans. I have to go to Atlanta.....To buy my wife!" (Kas, Chapter 6). I remember where I was when I read this chapter and literally laughing out loud. The people around me looked at me like I was coo-coo. In the two previous books we lived all the emotions that permeated the life of Raina - Rain. In Book # 1 we knew her story, her struggle to defeat the monster of aggression received by her own father and boyfriend. Until she meets Kas, with his protective way - besides his work itself - and feelings take a different tack.

In book # 2 Kas decides to fight for Rain and they live a love of freedom , in which every day Rain re-learn

to trust the people around her. That and her work in unraveling codes and be an interpreter in catching bad guys and rescue abused and slavery women.

In this book # 3, Karen-Anne knew how to balance the romantic side of the couple with all the scenes of drama and suspense necessary to complete the trilogy.

Raina is increasingly involved in the persecution of Ghost, and what's worse, she has become his preferred target.

Rain, more than a pretty face, has a privileged brain, and her opponent starts to literally play chess with her. With each move, a person - or group of them - could be saved or disappear forever.

Kas doesn't like Rain super involvement and tries to save her in every way, but the truth was that Rain was the central point of all this research. Or we could say this "hunting".

For him it was very difficult, with his overprotective way, to see her working long hours, and more, see her involved in some missions.

The whole story starts with a very strong action scene. The book # 2 ended in cliffhanger (ah, yes, Karen-Anne LOVES make us suffer like this!) In which her psychopath ex-boyfriend gets out of jail and goes after her. High doses of adrenaline.

And there's a hilarious scene in which, in the midst of a mission, Kas is required to travel in a hurry to go... buy his wife. That means their life was not monotonous.

But the most beautiful thing is to see the emotional growth of Rain, as she turns in that insecure girl, who felt unworthy of receiving love and worth being spanking, to a safe and with strong convictions woman....

This is the final book of the Rain trilogy and we finally get an actual ending, no more cliffhangers! I think by far this is the best book of the trilogy.

The storyline in this book is not so much about the romance but about Kas and Raina’s job and trying to put away the “ghost”. This was such a great ending to the Rain trilogy. In the beginning of the series (Saving Rain), Raina is a bit more reserved, understandably, but by the end she had changed so much. Not her personality; she was still the sweet, kind, and caring woman as before, but her outlook on life. I loved that we were able to watch her grow as a person – stronger and more confident in herself – as well as watch her and Kas's relationship develop over the pages. Through the whole series, Kas had been dealing with his own internal conflicts over how to keep Raina safe without smothering her with his protective nature, and that struggle really shone through in this book. He made mistakes, but ultimately had to learn to trust her in the same way she had to learn to trust him.

I think one of my favorite parts of this whole series was the Ghost, not him as a character, per se, but the way the author wrote him. In the first two books he is just that, a ghost whose shadow we see, but never quite part of the story. In this book we get a whole lot more of him and what made him tick. It was really quite enlightening. I thought the author did a great job with not only dealing with the sensitive issues raised in this story but also the details of the job and the situations involved as a whole.
