On that fateful Saturday in May 2008, neither could have conceived that the men they had once loved would do anything to harm their children. But they were wrong, so terribly wrong.

Nothing can bring their children back. But June and Giselle have one solitary comfort: they are no longer alone. Their lives may have been torn apart, but they have each other. Together, they are stronger.

This is the story of their parallel journeys: of the dreadful days before, during, and after the murders of their children. Told in their own words, with searing honesty of their pain, and guilt, it is a story of endurance, friendship, and survival against the odds. It is not a story for the faint hearted, but it is a story that must be told, for in the end, it is a testament to the human spirit.

For me, the worst offender was Ash. For all Rab's disgusting behaviour, I'd say you knew where you stood with him but I think Ash was a really sly case. I hated to read about how he manipulated little Paul....there was some humour from the ladies, who both have terrific families around them, thank goodness, helping them to go on after these godawful crimes. And of course there were parts that made me more than a bit sniffy, especially reading about June's pyjamas and Jay-Jay's hammer.....

I was staggered by the sentences handed down in both cases. Neither were sufficiently long enough.

Two passages really struck me (and others, since they were previously highlighted by readers before me)...."....the family annihilator is responsible for more than one-third of child murders" and "....children may be safer on the street with strangers than they are in their own homes".....they're both frighteningly scary and go against all that kids have been taught for hundreds of years. As one lawyer said, these types of crimes are on the increase. That really makes you think.....as did what psychologist Ian Stephen said, too, "They are the nice guys.....and they live next door".

I did spot a couple of words they should correct. Subtly used and not subtlety and, describing newborn Paul, "His oval face, with its tiny, perfect features, was surmounted by a thatch of dark hair." That's the wrong word but I couldn't think of the one needed to replace it !
