Compromised Inside is a great continuation to the series. Once again FURC is under attack but this time as the title implies it is from inside their own bodies and compound. Kat and David's parents are once again proving to be dishonest and showing that rulers unchecked can be very shady. I still don't trust Verity and feel very sorry for David that he has her for a mother. She is very conceited and untrustworthy.

Kat and Tony continue their feeble attempts at fighting their feelings for each other. Caroline does do a couple of things that show she is not just a show off but overall she continues being the confident actress of the book. There are plenty of other characters who show they are different than one originally may have thought while others fortify the readers' initial reaction to them.

Compromised inside by Litherland was not a patch on Book 2 which was all outside the compound. This time Litherland places the reader inside a community that has its share of egos. The hidden movers and shakers want a virus to be introduced so they can build an immunity. Not everyone is cognizant of this which causes major tension at the end. So we have two scenarios, the clinic with the sick people, and the upcoming elections. There is too much medical jargon which I glazed over. One of the main characters is Kat who seems to rise to any occasion and takes out the bad guys. There is a little romance with her but she keeps Tony at a distance. Until her mother steps in. Many in the community turn feral but it is one of the security who turns rogue and a committee member is killed. So, plenty of drama to keep one reading.

Another great addition to the Slowpocalypse series.

At the beginning you have brief character descriptions to brush you up or introduce you if you're new to the series, these are very helpful.

In this chapter of the story politics come into play with some of the councilors trying to manipulate and backstab each other to jockey for position of first councilor. While this is going on the leaders are dealing with a dangerous virus spreading through the complex, some food shortages due to the loss of an extremely important food staple, and irate mobs. There are some awesome unexpected twists and a couple of instances that point to some really cool stuff coming further along in the story.

All of the characters we know and love are here plus some new ones that are important to the story. The main characters are all fleshed out wonderfully and I feel like they're people I actually know. I was very happy to learn that book five is on the way plus there is a possibility of quite a few more. I'll be starting book four as soon as possible.

I also love that there are no big cliffhangers at the end of each book, just an interesting lead in to the next, everything is wrapped up perfectly. That way each book works like a separate episode, you're given enough information to make you want to keep reading and not left completely unsatisfied.
