This is my preschooler's new favorite book, and we have read it a dozen times so far. It's cute in its silliness and shorter and less difficult to endure than many other children's books that I have been forced to read multiple times.

Rather than containing any moral such as *always do a test run before going live with something new*, *don't attempt home repairs on sophisticated equipment*, or even *stick to what you know*, it seems to be in the storytelling tradition of lovable protagonist gets in wacky trouble after which everyone has a good laugh, and the damage is simply written off. The story inexplicably reminded me of the episode of "I Love Lucy" in which Lucy and Ethel stomp grapes. Perhaps it's the *vino-gelato* connection.

If this book put you in the mood for another cupcake catastrophe, try Fancy Nancy and the Delectable Cupcakes.
