Book Review

Review: After the completely breath-taking ending of Dark Night I honestly had no idea what to expect from Bright Hopes. As expected we pick up exactly where we left off. So, they remaining riders and dragons have escaped the warrens and are trying to get to some form of safety before the Ifrits catch up to them again.

Both Amel and the Dominar are gravely injured and both need treatment soon but there is a bigger issue as Savette, the Chosen One is also dying making everything feel hopeless but she manages to use the last of her power to save Amel in the hopes that she can reason with Hubric and get the Dominar treatment before he bleeds to death or the infection takes his life. When she speaks to Hubric for the first time since the warrens she tells him that she believe the man under the Dominar's mask isn't the Dominar she believes that it is Iskaris and that going to Umtal instead of the Dragon lands like everyone else may have them walking into a trap.

Amel knows that if her suspicions are correct then she will be leading a traitor into the hands of Starie, the false Chosen one and that the real Dominar is out there somewhere will no guard, support or medical treatment. When Amel talks to Hubric he tells her that the mask makes the Dominar not the man and if it is Iskaris then he is now the Dominar and the real Dominar couldn't do anything because no one has seen his face as is the custom but Amel has although she doesn't tell Hubric this as Ashana swore her secrecy about what they did. Amel's suspicions are all but confirmed when the "Dominar" demands that the people with him aren't to leave Umtal until he gives them direct instruction to and with Savette dying they need to leave as soon as possible, but themselves, the Dominar and Iskaris are the only ones that know what happened in the warrens and Iskaris is the only who wouldn't want that news getting out.

Shortly after entering Umtal Hubric learns that the Dusk Covenant are twisting the truth making themselves out to be the bringers of peace beside Starie while the Lightbringers are being slandered in addition to being slaughtered whenever they are found. Their problems only get worse when he tells Amel that the "Dominar" has declared them to be Lightbringers and the in custody so there is no chance of escape or communication with the outside world beyond that of their dragons. At the same time Savette is getting weaker and weaker and without the help of the dragons she will die. Their situation is dire and desperate at best and I have no idea what is going to happen to the trio and it also begs the questions that if Iskaris is really posing as the Dominar where is the real one, is he still alive and safe or did he perish like so many others?

As we cross into the second half of the novel, the Lightbringers and dragons in Umtal are rounded up and transported but it an opportunity for them to escape given proper planning. However, Amel soon realises that the man in another cage is the real Dominar and with Raolcan's help he gets transferred into the same cage

as herself, Savette, Hubric and a few other Lightbringers but they have the problem that he isn't really the Dominar anymore, Iskaris is. The Dominar is going by the name Shonen whether that is his real name is unknown, but he is also one of the Lightbringers and between the four of them they induct Amel into their ranks, an official Lightbringers. However, the one thing I was wondering is Leng has disappeared completely Amel hasn't even thought about him for ages and I want him to come back soon, so I can see more of their developing romance although I can see Amel developing a friendship and maybe even a romantic relationship with Shonen in his absence.

When they fill Shonen in on who Savette is and what is happening to her he tells them that he knows of a way to save her. It turns out when Savette healed Amel is left a bit of her light inside her which healed her bad leg but in order to save Savette Shonen has to cut the bond to her dragon and Amel has to return her light meaning she will be a cripple again. Despite how much Amel wants to keep her healed leg and be normal she wants to have her friend back more. They manage to save Savette, but I fear they have been discovered but Raolcan as always has a plan although it is improvised.

I amend what I said earlier about Leng not being mentioned in ages, but his entrance was beautiful as was his reunion with Amel however, it wasn't clear how many were lost or whether Hubric and Shonen are okay as we sort of lose focus on them in all the chaos. All I can say is this series is one of my favourites this year and I can't wait to get my hands-on Mark of Loyalty very soon and see what happens next.
