I was so honored to be given an ARC by Missy Johnson. I had read "**Seduced**" a while back and absolutely loved that one. So I knew I was in for a treat with "**Wildcard**"!!

Ryder Stevens is a British Pro Tennis player with a "Bad Boy" reputation. He parties hard and loves to hook up with a different woman every night. During a night of debauchery, Ryder ends up with an injury that has him sidelined from the game for a bit.

His buddy suggests he read some of the fan mail he's received in order to pass the time. Ryder stumbles upon an interesting letter from a seven year old boy in Chicago, named Jake Calera. The boy pretty much calls Ryder out on all his bad behavior and Ryder is intrigued enough to call the boy, but gets Scarlett, his mom, instead. She's got the same amount of spunk that the boy has and Ryder seems to eat it up.

The two end up having numerous phone calls and Ryder enjoys their chats. Scarlett challenges him to do selfless things for others to prove he's not the immature man whore that he's portrayed as in the tabloids.

He learns that Jake has cystic fibrosis and that there is a Doctor in London that is running a Clinical Trial on an experimental drug that may help him. He is able to pull some strings and soon Scarlett and Jake are on a plane to London to meet with the Doctor.

The attraction is undeniable once the two meet face to face.

I loved seeing the feelings between Ryder and Scarlett develop.

A woman has never affected Ryder the way that Scarlett has. Whenever they were together, he acted as if he worshiped her. I was quite smitten with Ryder.

Ryder is going crazy from the loss of his independence and one day he's so bored he decides to answer some of his fan-mail. He finds the letter of a little boy who's sick and in his letter to Ryder the boy expresses his disappointment on the athlete for his selfish and irresponsible behavior. The injury is forcing Ryder to re-evaluate his life and in hopes to make things better he reaches out to the boy, but it won't be as easy as the kid' mother knows exactly who Ryder is and wants nothing from him.

This Bad Boy is relentless and continues to call everyday, eventually making friends with Scarlett and her son, who is sick with Cystic Fibrosis.
