The LOST series by Cynthia Eden was one of those series in the beginning that I wasn't sure if I was going to read or not, but once I got started I was hooked and started looking forward to every single book just hoping the release dates wouldn't be too far apart. Taken was a phenomenal addition to this series and I loved every moment of it.

Bailey Jones is a survivor of a serial killer who is known as the Death Angel. She was held captive and tortured for days when she hears the screams of another victim and tries to help only to be left for dead. After being found barely alive she informs authorities that the other victim got away, but they don't believe her since there was no evidence supporting her claim. Now months later Bailey reaches out to LOST to see if they can find this mysterious woman and she is paired with new LOST agent Asher Young. Asher comes off as dangerous, but there is something about him that makes Bailey feel safe. The more that they look for this woman the closer they get but danger isn't far behind them.

Ex-SEAL and LOST agent Asher Young might be fairly new to the team, but he is damn good at what he does. After meeting Bailey for the first time he knows there is something about her that calls to him and

makes him want to protect her. But since she is a client and is still recovering from what the Death Angel did he knows he should be hands off, except that is getting harder and harder. Asher knows he can protect her and as things start occurring once they return to the site of where it all happened he believes that Bailey was telling the truth and just maybe the Death Angel has unfinished business with Bailey.

Taken gave me chills from the very first page, it was thrilling, heart pounding and had me double checking my locks. Bailey and Asher were such great characters. I loved how Ms. Eden had them bond over their abductions. Bailey from the start was a good person not only because she wanted to find this missing woman but she has been saving her money just to hire LOST for the job. Asher's past was a bit on the dark side but I couldn't get enough of him and the protectiveness he showed with Bailey.

I loved the whole serial killer idea that shapes this series and thought Ms. Eden put a very real spin on this story. Bailey Jones is the only known survivor of a serial killer known as the Angel of Death. Except Bailey saw another woman there. One who Bailey helped to escape and then she just disappeared. From the deputy who rescued her to the shirk she's been seeing, no one believes her. But Bailey knows the woman was there and has come to LOST for help in locating her. She never expected to be attracted to the agent assigned to her.

LOST agent Asher Young knows all about the fear, pain, horror, and guilt that Bailey carries around inside her. His own experiences have left a darkness in him that he fears may strike out at Bailey should he give in to the burning attraction that is slowly consuming him.

As more bodies turn up, all marked with the same tattoo that the Angel of Death used on his victims, Asher fears that whoever is playing games with them will not stop until they claim their final victim-Bailey.

Taken is the fifth installment in Eden's dark romance suspense thriller series-LOST. Based on the LOST agency (Last Option Search Team) that uses their considerable skills to help law enforcement find people, each story revolves around a couple who helps one another to keep from tumbling into the abyss. Though each book is loosely based on the agency and the arc bleeds over a little, each one can be comfortably read as a standalone.

Dark, gritty, and intense, Eden gives life to our worst fears as she slowly builds a harrowing tale of intrigue, suspense, deception, and horror that all revolves around one person-Bailey Jones-and a memory that no one is sure is even real. The heavy atmosphere pulls us into the story instantly as Eden jettisons the reader in the past and we experience Bailey's kidnapping through her eyes as it happens. The fear, pain, confusion, and horror all blend together as she tries to understand what is happening. When Bailey is able to escape her bonds and surprise the killer with another woman. The woman escapes, leaving Bailey with the killer, and

Bailey finds herself once again at death's door. When she is saved by the police and assured her tormenter is dead, we skip forward to the present and her hiring of LOST.

Taken is easy to follow romance wise; Eden uses dual narrative and internal memory flashes of the protagonists' pasts in order to flesh them out and help build on the chemistry that ignites upon their first meeting. The mystery itself is a little more complicated. Though somewhat formulaic overall; two damaged people, a vicious series of crimes, a race against time; the always smooth presentation and intriguing clues dropped gives rise to intense emotions as the plot picks up speed, leaving the reader tense with anticipation till the very last page. Eden methodically maps out Bailey and Asher's investigation and the police interactions, creating a solid base on which to build this decidedly convoluted mystery.

Bailey and Asher are an interesting mixture of contrasts and similarities, adding depth and background to the main storyline. The romance holds an integral place in the story and Eden uses the investigation to help draw out their developing emotions for one another. Strong sexual tension only adds to this couple's appeal.

Bailey has lost so much since her kidnapping and torture. Her whole life has been turned upside down and she is merely a shell of who she used to be. She fears everything and is constantly harassed by the media. Her reaching out to LOST is two-fold. She wants to find the other survivor and take her life back. Asher Young is an ex-navy seal who joined LOST after he was discharged; much to the relief of his friend and the owner, Gage. He and his twin sister were also the victims of a kidnapping as teenagers...only their story ended a little differently with Asher killing the kidnappers. Asher is a natural born protector. The kidnapping affected him deeply and he has spent his life in dangerous situations to make sure no one suffers like he and his sister did ever again. Both he and Bailey are scared that their pasts now define them but together they learn differently.

A diverse cast of secondary characters keeps the suspense and mystery flowing smoothly. Each person adds personality, drama, and insight into the story. Through them we finally get the full truth behind what exactly happened to Bailey and why. The events leading up to the reveal is quite a twisted journey. At times I did feel that the story dragged in the areas. There was a lot going on and it seemed to stumble over itself as Eden began to untangle all the threads and lead us towards the end.

Eden wraps up everything nice and neat in a climactic finale that answers our questions and wraps up all the loose ends. Bailey and Asher are left in a good place and Eden gives us a preview of the next story, Wrecked, and heroine, Asher's twin sister, Ana.

The LOST series is one of the best romantic suspense series that I have ever read... seriously, every book has been stellar. Cynthia Eden does both romance and suspense extremely well and she has become an auto-buy author for me. While you may be able to read these as standalones, I would not recommend it. You want the background on each LOST team member, so I advise reading from the beginning.

The heroine and damsel in distress of this installment is Bailey Jones, who is the survivor of a serial killer

known as the Death Angel. Only six months have passed since her escape, and she has understandably closed herself off from almost everyone and everything. However her drive to find another survivor sees her seeking assistance from LOST. Bailey was a sympathetic and engaging heroine. My heart went out to her with everything she went through, but I also admired the strength and determination that we saw in this story. She really wanted to take her life back and she wasn't going to let anything or anyone stand in her way, especially all the people that wanted to coddle her and treat her as a victim.

The LOST agent taking lead on this assignment is Asher Young, who I was super curious about in the last book or two. Asher and his twin sister, Ana, are both working for LOST, and they have a tortured past of their own. Asher is a former Navy SEAL, a trained killer with a wounded soul. He is undeniably attracted to Bailey from the first meeting, but he is afraid to engage in romantic entanglements for reasons that are best discovered by the reader. I loved Asher... he has a strong protective instinct and is seriously bad ass. I hated that what he went through was having such a lasting effect on his love life, but I was stoked that he was willing to give things a shot with Bailey.

Once LOST starts working the case into finding the missing survivor, the action heats up very quickly and Bailey is again in a killer's crosshairs. The suspense and thriller aspects of this story were front and center for me... I was focused on them more than I was the romance. Not that the romance wasn't good - it was - but I was just really trying to figure out "who dunnit"! As I was reading, I was making notes in my reading journal re: who I thought the culprit was... and of course I was wrong wrong wrong (kinda). I don't think I have ever completely guessed the correct killers in this series... Cynthia Eden's twisty goodness keeps me turning the page as fast as my eyes can move. I love the fast pace of the story because my adrenaline gets going and I can knock out the entire 400 pages in just a few hours. I am hoping to meet this author at a signing soon because I want a keepsake copy of this series!

She was probably my favourite heroine ever, she literally went through hell and just came out stronger. A lot of people try to justify their bad decisions, their poor behaviour because of something that happened to them in past. They say it broken them and that everything bad that happened to them now justify what they are doing.

I have zero respect for those people, a lot of people bears their demons, their shitty past, and still they decide that that's not going to ruin them. And that was what this heroine did. She took things in her own hands and said: I am not going to be afraid. I am not going to stop living.

What I love is that this heroine, this strong woman, got exactly what she deserved (thankfully) a strong man who is not afraid of her bad days, someone who is going to be there for her, someone who is possessive but not overbearing. And I love that. I love how he pushed but he didn't push too much, how he was overprotective but didn't take away her choices. And he didn't act like asshole, as so many 'alpha' heroes in books tend to do when things are not going their way.

"The scars you carry show how strong you are. They show that you are a fighter. You didn't let him win. You're alive. You made it."

They had great chemistry, and Cynthia Eden sure knows how to write hot scenes without them feeling cheap.

Romantic suspense is one of my favourite tropes in books, so I tend to be a little sensitive when the suspense story is written a little ridiculous. Unlike in Lazarus series, here I wouldn't say anything about mystery was ridiculous but I had a few problems that I noticed already in Cynthia Eden books that **I don't like :**

? The mystery starts out strong, but kinda fizzles towards the end

? one of the reasons why it starts to fizzle is because the author writes too many coincidences, somehow everything turns connected at the end, and that's not how it works in rl

? FBI, police etc etc are filled with smart people and yet the bad guy is always someone they didn't check that is close to the case. I mean come on, you check those people first. And at the end before they catch the killer they always ask themselves questions that they should have asked fucking sooner. I mean, we are talking about 'geniuses' here lol

? same thing goes to the bad guys, they are oh so smart through book until, conviniately, the end

? I feel that sometimes the bad guys are almighty lol

But despite that, I feel that she knows how to write suspense, especially the beginning but somehow doesn't know later how to tie loose ends.

Cynthia Eden has the ability to take you into the darkest minds out there and to make you question

everything. I love her Romantic Suspense books because there isn't one that I have read from her that I didn't connect with in a strong way. Maybe it sounds crazy, but even when she does the killers POV, I still connect to them because she just writes that well.

Taken felt different from the other books in the Lost series, but in a good way. The main characters weren't as connected to *LOST* as they were in the previous books. It almost felt like the team was branching out and that Asher and Ana, the new members, are going to be working more independently than together. I actually really liked the change since it kept past characters from taking over the focus of the books by being mentioned in a big way.

Bailey was a great character for this book and I liked that she was tough and could handle herself, but still had a soft side and let Asher help her. They were amazing together and right away you could see the connection they shared. Asher was the protector in this story but he had his times where he was the one needing protecting and I loved that he wasn't too "macho" to actually accept the help Bailey offered.

I was in a mood for a good Romantic Suspense, and this was in my email, so win-win! That's the best thing about a Cynthia Eden book-you just know you'll get a fantastic story!

This is the latest book in her *LOST* (Last Option Search Team) series, and it's excellent. Asher is given his own investigation to run, and even though he's new to *LOST*, he's not new to the danger that comes with the job.

Bailey survived a serial killer. Barely. But even though she survived, she can't help but wonder about the woman she saw being held with her. So she hires *LOST* to find this woman. She went to the police, but they never found signs of any woman and put it off to Bailey imagining her. After all, the brain does crazy things when in survival mode.

But she's been getting calls, calls that she tries to put off as crank callers, but probably aren't. It's possible her nightmare isn't over.

Asher doesn't want to screw up his first investigation, but he's so attracted to Bailey he's afraid it's hindering his judgement. But it turns out Bailey was right, and there was another woman in that remote cabin in the mountains. But did she make it out alive?

Bailey knows she's been hiding. She doesn't want to admit it, but her paranoia has her hiding in her own home. She's finally ready to face the world again. She may have survived a sadistic serial killer, but she needs to learn to live again, not just exist.
