For the Bite Of It is the first book in the Orbus Arcana series and it introduces us to the gruff cop, John Reeder, and his vampire lover, Vince Kamateros. I struggled with this one from the beginning, despite its occasional redeeming moments. Vince is a fairly interesting character and while not fully developed, he definitely feels more fleshed out than John or anyone else in the book. His reason for exile is fairly straightforward, but the nature of the Orbus Arcana is less so. I was never quite sure what they do or what control they have over vampires save that it is absolute...except when it isn't. There is reference to a growing rebellion, but the core of the book focuses on the murder and the initial phases of John and Vince's relationship. I would say the murder is a fairly useless subplot. It never goes anywhere and given that Vince is ruled out as a suspect fairly early on, there's never even a threat to either he or John. It's an excuse for these two to meet and that's fine, but it serves as page filler rather than an a meaningful addition to the overall story.

For Vincent Kamateros, it struck the morning his landlord crashed through the window of his bakery in his car, only to be discovered to be dead. Not a propitious start to the day. But it led to the arrival of hot and sexy police detective John Reeder.

And now the complications begin—those nasty little things that like to bite you in the ass.

Vincent is not the innocuous baker he appears to be—he's a vampire in exile for something he didn't do. And he's the heir apparent, oldest son of the King. But to John, he's a complication John doesn't need, because John is a deeply closeted gay man, who has no intention of stepping foot outside his comfortable closet anytime soon.

Plus, as if things aren't difficult enough, Vince is a suspect in the landlord's murder.

The attraction between them cannot be denied. But John's doing his damnedest to do just that. Plus Vince

knows better than to get emotionally involved with a human. As a vampire, it's not allowed, but as heir to the throne? That's just begging for trouble. But he's never felt this way before, and these feelings are crumbling his determination. How likely is he to be forgiven and to receive his powers back? Why not live a little?

I got to admit authors Viki Lyn and Vina Grey deliver a sexy tale filled with smoldering vampires, cupcakes and a simmering sexual tension that leaves you in the end wanting to jump your significant other's bones. The authors do a wonderful job in creating a world that draws the reader in, keeps them captivated and eager for more when the last page is read. The story flows nicely though it does have a few things that left me wondering if the scenes in the beginning were just fillers (John and Vincent's occupations for example are only mentioned a hand full of times and you never see them doing their jobs so to speak after meeting one another).

Meet Vincent and John. Vincent is a century's old and powerful vampire who was exiled and now runs a cupcake bakery. John is a closeted cop who finds himself attracted to Vincent. A mystery, secrets and powerful sexual tension will keep the reader on the edge of their seat until the very end. I got to admit; I

loved how John flummoxed Vincent and kept him on his toes. These two dance around one another, falling in and out of bed with abandon even as the secrets that Vincent holds will either break these two apart or bring them together. Only time will tell on that aspect of the story. These two characters dance and weave around one another with the grace of a dancer, letting the reader see one thing even as another scene is playing out in the background. I loved how these two main characters interact with one another and I can foresee the fireworks that will ensue after John finds out Vincent's secrets. The secondary characters keep the story flowing nicely and were as well written as John and Vincent were.

FOR THE BITE OF IT is just the beginning of a new series from authors Viki Lyn and Vina Grey. I really liked how they fleshed out the background of the main characters and it gave the story more depth as well. Humor, sexy scenes and more abound within the story and I can attest I am eager for book two now. I tend to find myself, from time to time, migrating towards stories with less-than stellar ratings; I've found a few gems out there that I would have never read had I not given the story a fair chance on my own. I also seem to love what some have not, and disliked what other's loved, so when I was approached about reading For the Bite of It, which was re"vamp"ed and given an extended ending I thought, why not, let's go for it and see what's what...and I'm glad that I did.

Vincent is an exiled vampire who was cast out from his family and his position as heir to throne by the Vampire High Council for a crime he did not commit. His love and the safety of and for his family were worth the banishment, even though he is very much missing them and the loss of his powers. Seriously, a vampire without his powers is like a cup of hot cocoa without whipped cream, you just can't have one without the other without feeling the loss.

John is a closeted, sometimes real jack-ass of a cop who is investigating a murder and Vincent is front and center as his primo suspect and, unfortunately, John is strongly attracted to the man as well. Horrible news for a guy who wants to remain in the closet. He plays a terrible game of "mixed-signals" with Vincent, and the two stay on a collision course of "should we or shouldn't we", mixed in with some pretty steamy sex.

This is a fast paced murder mystery slash paranormal with a side dish of secrets and lies on both John's and Vincent's parts. John just confuses the hell out of Vincent and for a vampire that's been around a long time that is no easy feat. Vincent on the other hand is forced to keep his lineage and vampirism a secret or risk John's life. Not the best recipe for a vampire baker and human cop who are trying to find their footing in the romantic relationship arena. Trust is a big deal and that's just not in the cards for these guys right now.

For the Bite of It is book one in the Orbus Arcana series and thus far we are left with quite a few unanswered questions. The secrets are numerous and I foresee that the repercussions will be abundant in the next book. However, John and Vincent have decided to make a go of it and for now Vincent's true identity is still unknown to John. As hot headed as John is I can just imagine the fight that will ensue when he finds out. It won't be pretty.

So back to less-than stellar reviews mentioned above; I can totally see where they came from without the extended ending and revisions. Yes, we are still left with some unfinished business, but the series is as yet unfinished and the answers are forthcoming, so with that said, I feel confident in recommending this series for those looking for a fast paced, work-in-progress vampire paranormal.
