Red Mortal is the final, marvelous installment of the Gods of Midnight paranormal series. I love the hunky immortal Spartan heroes. This story can be read by itself but because many characters return it would be best appreciated by reading the prior books in order. This is an epic romance because it includes the highly anticipated romance between the goddess Daphne (the Oracle of Delphi), and the noble and King of the Spartans, King Leonidas.

In this book, the two star crossed lovers were kept apart by the fact that Daphne was never able to appear visible to the noble King even as she longed for him from afar. Now he finally has the ability to see her and he is just as smitten by her as she is by him. But Daphne's brother, Ares, the God of War is jealous. Even though she is his sister he wants her for himself. As punishment, Ares removes Leonidas's immortality. Daphne hopes to prevent Leonidas from aging by staying away from him. Leonidas is hurt by her long absence but thankfully Daphne cannot help herself from staying away. They hope to find a cure but after failed attempts Leonidas turns away from Daphne. He doesn't want her to see him suffer and waste away. Will they ever find a cure? With a conspirator working for Ares in their ranks, it looks grim.

This story has high drama as the star crossed lovers finally find love only to have it ripped apart by petty jealousy. I really wanted them to be together. I loved the stoic and honorable King and anxiously turned the pages as I hoped he could find a cure in time. The author really ratchets up the tension as Daphne and Leonidas try to find help and are disappointed again and again. This is a very romantic book that lovers of books like Romeo and Juliet will especially enjoy. The main characters time together is limited and because of this it is very poignant to read. The only thing about this story that didn't make sense to me was why the Goddess, Daphne seemed so ineffectual. I kept hoping she would have more powers to help Leonidas. I really did feel her love and longing for Leonidas but although she is supposedly immortal for some reason she didn't seem as mature as he was. Still, this was an exciting book brimming with emotion and several very intriguing characters.

I totally rooted for the doomed couple and was so happy they had finally found each other, a very satisfying paranormal romance for readers who love star crossed lovers.
