SE Harmon does OFY a little differently.

Blue is an NFL player on the field and a get-himself-some player after hours. It's not as if it's difficult for a famous NFL star to line up some company for the night. He takes advantage of the easy opportunities, there are no expectations, and no sleepovers.

Kelly is a college physics professor, tatted and pierced up, but a total nerd by his own admission. Openly gay, he has zero fucks to give about what people think. Except for Blue, of course - his best friend since grade school.

Kelly and Blue have a really close relationship. They talk multiple times a week, even with Blue travelling for football. Oh, and Kelly has been in love with Blue since forever, too.

I want to point out that this book does not delicately handle the OFY arc. Harmon has a knack for making her characters blunt with biting honesty and sarcasm. These MCs more so than any of her others. And while it totally worked for me, I can see how others may not take to Blue and Kelly's brand of honesty and humor. For example, Kelly coming out to his parents:

"[...]This was fairly anticlimactic."

My mother blinked at me. "That's a good thing, isn't it?"

"I need a story, Ma. This is not a good coming-out story." I raised an eyebrow. "They're going to take my gay card for this. I hope you're happy."

Kelly knows it's a lost cause with Blue. He knows there is no amount of bend to his sexuality. So he doesn't shy away from a random date or two.....or a quick hookup, during this story. (And for that matter, there is some page time with Blue and his lady friend of the night too - not too explicit, so don't worry).

Blue has some niggles about Kelly's dates though. He writes it off, for a while, as just wanting to keep his best friend to himself. He doesn't want to share Kelly's time with people.

And then a tipsy Blue decides to get his curiosity on.

This is the part of the story that made me a **tad** uncomfortable. Of course Kelly isn't going to say no. He's been in love with the man for years and has a chance to **touch** Blue! I can't say I blame him too much. But Kelly shares his feelings with Blue, and Blue is kind of a dick about it. He just wants his best friend. There's no need to go there or for things to be any different than they've always been. And, unltimeately.....

"I'm in the NFL. You know how people are. That would be making a statement that I'll never be willing to make."

Shot to the heart. But fair enough, right? Everyone should be able to make that choice for themselves, but, damn, their honesty with each other consisted of repeated punches to the gut.

I was mad at Blue for satisfying his curiosity with his best friend, knowing how Kelly felt about him. How can you call yourself a best friend?

But, make no mistake, it ends well. I appreciated the way Blue's acceptance of his evolving sexuality played out. It wasn't hearts and flowers. But for an NFL player, I found it to be very realistic. All that internalized homophobia, I imagine, has to be a very real thing for athletes, especially the ones with fathers who felt a certain way about "the gays."

I'd say that if you want your OFY/Bi-FY to be a **delicate** evolution with tons of self-insight and discovery, using PC terms, this isn't the story for you. Harmon writes blunt and in-your-face characters with matching dialogue. I found that it worked for me.

The relationship angst was like crack to me. Add in best friends-to-lovers? I loved it. Recommended.

I've already figured out what I want. It's time for you to do the same."

However, this features an adamantly heterosexual star athlete whose gay bestie is in love with him and is tossed liberally with female bits and in the closet overtones, understandably giving me plenty of reasons to furrow my brow.

So yes, I shook my head about 90% of time while listening to this, as Blue tries to reconcile these quasi-new feelings towards his bff. Once they cross the line, Blue's not sure about going all in, but he's not satisfied in going back to friendship only either. However, Kelly isn't about to let him have his cake and eat it too and therein lies the rub.

Props to Harmon in giving both Kelly and Blue distinct voices, completely likeable personalities, and a dynamic that obviously clicked. It doesn't hurt at all that these two were hot as fire. My brain short circuited no less than 8 times!

I absolutely believe that the narration by Alexander Cendese and Sean Crisden literally brought Kelly and Blue to life and made them and this story 10 times better. They delivered their lines with precision, expounding on the sarcasm, the snark, the doubt, the back and forth, and the above mentioned seriously-too-hot-to-handle chemistry between these two. *Unf*.

- Best friends to lovers (I never get tired of this trope!)
- Sexual discovery 101 (Blue knows he's not the straight arrow he appears to be, and whom better to ask for a gay trial run than his best friend?)
- Banter and more banter (These two have known each other for eons, and it shows in their easy conversations filled with inside jokes and casual snark.)
- Opposites attract (Blue is a cocky, self-assured athlete; Kelly is ... not.)

- Fun twist on the OFY trope (Blue doesn't go all drama-llama; yeah, he's worried about what others will think if he embraces his gay side and he waffles on whether he's bi or not like every other hour, but he doesn't get all weird and angsty. If anything, he's too laidback and takes Kelly for granted.)

So it's all fun and games until someone gets hurt; THUMBS down because:

- Blue is kind of an arse when Kelly admits that the "experiment" is more to him than just sex.

Blue thinks only about what HE wants. His epiphany is triggered by jealousy and a talking to from one of his friends, which, FINE, we all get places on our own terms. But I wanted Blue to delve deeper.

- The steam was just so-so. For a gay virgin and a whole lot of UST, the steamy scenes were really tame; they weren't fade-to-black exactly, but they were truncated and perfunctory. I needed way more sexy for the OFY angle to feel real.

- The ending kind of sucked, and surprisingly it wasn't Blue's fault. It was Kelly's. I don't even get where Kelly was coming from in trying to, what . . . PROTECT Blue?

Blue didn't need protecting. He's a grownass man with his own damn mind, and he strung Kelly along like, enough already; let the man do his thing before he flip-flops yet again. I didn't really trust Blue to stand by his decision, so the ending didn't feel like much of a HEA.

I have a weakness for self discovery stories, the best-friends-to-lovers trope, and banter. In my opinion, SE Harmon nails all three, here. I love her style of storytelling and relationship development, too. It wasn't an easy road, for the MC's, but I liked it.

Britton "Blue" Montgomery is a veteran NFL player. He works hard, plays hard, and knows what he wants. Well, career-wise, anyway. He's never really been in the market for a relationship, preferring to play that field, too. Finding sex isn't difficult when you're a rich, built, tight-end in the NFL, after all, but trusting that someone is interested in you and not your status, is tough.

Kelly Cannon is a physics professor. Geeky and academic, but with the twist of piercings and tattoos. He's a bit unconventional in the class room, but he loves his job (most days) and his life (again, most days). He teaches, meets friends at the local pub, goes to Blue's home games and has what he wants. Mostly. He's also in love with his best friend...but doesn't see any way that could end well.

Blue and Kelly have been practically inseparable since they were 12 years old. They each have the other's back. They speak their minds and tend to be pretty open and honest with one another. The one exception was Kelly's feelings toward Blue. I mean, Blue knew Kelly loved him, but didn't know Kelly was in-love with him. For Blue's part, he wasn't honest with himself about his feelings toward Kelly, so he sent all kinds of conflicting signals Kelly's way, being possessive of Kelly, wanting more and then backtracking several times. Blue just had all kinds of trouble finding his feet, sexually speaking, and it really showed.

I thought I'd be bothered by how Blue kept backtracking, but I kind of got it, here. Blue does not shift gears quickly, at all, and though - once he started seeing Kelly in a sexual way - he acts on his curiosity, he has a lot of trouble reconciling his feelings for his best friend with the expectations of his father and the NFL. You could say he has some trouble getting out of his own way, but once he finally made the decision to move forward, I trusted it. He took the time and thought it out and made the decision.

Though I trust Blue and Kelly's HEA, here, I would have loved to have gotten an epilogue, just to seal the deal, further. I see other story opportunities, here though, with other MC's, so maybe we'll get to see them happy and settled in a future book. That is my hope, anyway!

Let me begin with what I liked about the story: I loved the humor, the banter, and the snark.

I checked under the throw pillows and between the couch cushions, and she scowled. "What're

I liked that the story is told from both Kelly and Blue's POV. Unfortunately, **it's much harder to explain why I didn't like the story as a whole.** It's a bit slow-paced at times without actually being a slow burn, and the friends to lovers aspect didn't really work for me here, mostly because of the almost schizophrenic changes in attitude that Blue kept having.

I wasn't gay or bisexual. It was just that simple.

I'll admit that Kelly and Blue's whole will-they-won't-they simmering tension was *real*, folks - and it kept pulling me back in.

"You don't get to play with me, Blue." I wiped a hand over my mouth as though I could erase his taste from my lips, from my mind. I stabbed a finger in his direction. I was strong, and I was resolved, shaking finger be damned. "You don't get to play with my feelings."

And because of the dual POV I could see where both Kelly and Blue coming from, but even though Kelly occasionally stood up for himself, it made me sad more than hopeful that the one thing he couldn't get away from was the one thing that was destroying him, because Blue kept pulling him back in like a tractor beam.

"You're afraid if you lose me, you're going to lose your family, and that's just not true."

"That doesn't have anything to do with this."

"Doesn't it?" We stared at one another and had an entire angry conversation with eyes alone.

"You tell me that you were feeling it the way I was feeling it, and I'll let this whole thing go.

Just tell me that."

I could see the misery in his eyes as he swallowed. "I'm not willing to lose you over this. If this

is what we have to do to make it work, then that's fine by me. I can deal."

"You can deal." I laughed, and the sound was so bitter that we both winced. "I'm glad you can fucking deal with me wanting you."

I found it hard to follow along with how often Blue changes his tune...

When he finally spoke, his voice was so quiet I could barely hear him. "I'm in the NFL. You know how people are. That would be making a statement that I'll never be willing to make."

So even though they get together, they keep breaking apart...

Part of me thinks I could fall in love with you. The other part of me knows I already have.

Which brings me to the part I hated the most and colors the way I feel about the rest of the story - the tentative "Happy For Now" ending.

The entire book is a will-they-won't-they kind of story, so at the very end **when you get that tentative HFN ending, I didn't trust it because the entire book is Blue making an advance toward a relationship or physicality with Kelly and then immediately retreating.**

It's frustrating because good points are made along the way about why this *won't* work in the long run, and things that will inhibit the relationship from working, and then **the ending is so abrupt** that it doesn't give the reader an indication about whether those details actually come into play, or whether they were inflated because of fear, or founded but possibly easily overcome.

An epilogue would have gone a long, long way in assuaging those concerns - but there's no epilogue.

I wanted to know about Blue's father's reaction. I wanted the reactions of the coaching staff and players. I wanted the reaction of Kelly's family (which probably would have been hysterically funny). I wanted to know how Kelly's department head and school handled the media storm that was going to hit. I wanted to know how their relationship plays out, and I didn't get that, and it just made me very angry initially, and quite disappointed after I'd had some time to think about it.

So I liked parts of it, but for those reasons, on the whole, this was a miss for me.

Sometimes the heart just wanted what the heart wanted, and to hell with the consequences.

There is SO MUCH to like/love about this story: **the banter, the heehawlarious family dynamics, these characters, witty writing, great team dynamics and verisimilitude that spoke to me.** *The Blueprint* is the story of the evolution of platonic into romantic love and how uneasy that road can be. It's not fluffy and possesses a genuine melange of emotions. Maybe I would've liked more fluff, but throughout I respected where Harmon took the narrative. She stayed true to them and I applaud her for that.

Part best friends to lovers, part sports romance and part jock/nerd trope this is the story of Blue and Kelly who **have been best friends since forever**. Through thick and thin. Through a mom leaving. Through bunk beds and a shitty father. Through a metric ton of peanut M&Ms and a surprise peanut allergy. Through a trouble making sister and a plethora of bad decisions. Through high school when the jock/geek dynamic was fertile ground for a breakup and even their experimental college days. So something as fickle as the NFL doesn't stand a chance at separating them. **They are family.**

Family could be awkward, but you stayed.

Kelly has *always* been in love with Blue. No relationship has ever worked because they all suffer by comparison. Blue is straight and Kelly knows his pining is futile but there's a big difference between knowing a thing and accepting a thing. Even more confusing, every time Kelly tries to pull away, Blue tightens his hold. **Blue knows he needs Kelly, knows he loves Kelly. He just doesn't know what that means or what to do with or about those confusing feelings.**

The Blueprint tells the story of their watershed moment from both of their perspectives.

The things that I loved about this story are many including how accurate I found the portrayal of the NFL to be (**it's NFL heavy**) from the locker room dynamics to the pressure to perform and *conform*. Blue is 30 but in NFL years, that's old. He's two years older than Gronkowski, who's basically held together with twine, duct tape and Gorilla glue, so that sense of *always* looking over his shoulder for the replacement that's breathing down his neck resonated. I also loved how much he loves the game, because it's literally all he knows.

Which is why I think Kelly will be good for him long-term. Kelly won't allow him to give up once he's hung up his cleats; he'll bolster his self-worth. Because he is an indomitable SassMonster who will stay on his heels like a terrier. That's precisely what endeared him to me. He's snarky, witty and kind of a dick at times. Gawd, I hearted him and his dry erase markers and love of all things *Star Wars*.

Neither one of them are perfect, but they are soulmates.

The sex was true to them and sometimes funny. Really, many things about their interactions had me tittering and I liked that they could have fun during the sexy times. They have a synchronicity in all things that translated well to the bedroom. What they do seemed like a natural progression for a virgin. I enjoyed their **size difference** most of all, but there is also a **big guy bottoming, rimming, frottage and oral**. Also, there are mentions of sex with other people and some on page kissing for those that are sticklers for the couple to be true blue.

As much as I appreciated the truth of Harmon's narrative, the organicity of it, the push/pull is interminable. Harmon showed me why, showed the emotion and the angst they both struggle with, and as much as I understood their struggle I needed more of a payoff at the end. I would've liked more of them being incandescently happy together once they decide they're going to give boyfriending a go, though I did appreciate that there wasn't a manufactured/unrealistic ending. **But an epilogue probably would've gone a loooooonnnnggggg way.**

There are only two tragedies in life: one is not getting what one wants, and the other is getting it.

Regardless, I thoroughly enjoyed Harmon's writing style and look forward to reading her in the future and were she inclined to write Connor's story, I would be tickled pink to read that.
