Yeah! Sport gets his own adventure.... And what an adventure it is!

Sport is a former SEAL, now FBI agent, who just manages to follow the rules. Barely. He went running to Jackson's rescue with a team of FBI agents, even though he thought he was crazy. Now he knows Jackson wasn't imagining things, something did happen in the jungle. But there's not much he can do about it. Until his boss sends him to work under the Assistant Director of the Counterterrorism Division, Mike Arthurs. Arthurs sends him out on his own, on a secret mission to stalk Danny O'Sullivan, who may be involved in the jungle mess. Sport heads out, but it all smells a bit fishy to him. He tracks down the man he is told is hip deep in the mess, to see what he's up to. Danny O'Sullivan, super spy, and club owner. He finds Danny at the club he owns, breaks in to his office, and promptly gets caught.

Danny is a sneaky dude and was harder to pin down... He's a spy, working for someone doing something. He's a bad-ass, lots of training like Sport and Jackson, super sneaky, but we don't really get to know much about him. He somehow was involved in the mess in the jungle that hurt Jackson and killed their SEAL team mate, and wants to bring down the men who are responsible. He has been working on his own a long time, building up evidence and watching Sport. He's watched him, and is attracted to him, but needs him as part of this takedown plan he's been building. Unfortunately Sport jumps the gun and breaks in to his office, forcing Danny to involve him sooner than he would have. They don't have quite enough evidence so will need to work together to get more. But Sport doesn't believe Danny is on his side and will take some convincing.

I had a hard time getting in to this book and I'm not really sure why. I liked Sport and Danny for the most part, they are a good match physically, both had some similar emotional baggage, and their sex was pretty explosive. I liked that Jackson and Addy were in it so much. I liked Simon, the new addition to the story. I think it was the plot that was the problem for me. It was a lot of story that never went anywhere, lots of talking about what to do, but not a lot of doing. Everything was too easy. Danny walks in to the the FBI headquarters, goes in the Arthurs office and walks right out. Even with FBI agents after him, he doesn't get caught. I didn't buy it. Then after all the talk about trying to bring down the bad guys the solution was too easy and anticlimactic. I didn't understand why Danny needed Sport, why he waited so long, then why he freaked out and took off on his own.

I liked the tension between Sport and Danny, they walked that line between like and hate for quite a while. I wasn't sure about Danny, you think he's a good guy, but there was this little bit of a question in my mind, wondering if he really was. Sport questions it too, repeatedly, adding to the tension. I was so happy to see a sequel to the first book in this series coming out. This book ticks so many of my boxes even if I didn't already like this author I'd have picked this one up. Book two picks up after book one, so you will need to read the first book or you'll miss out on so much.

Without giving away too much of book one, Sport's black ops team was ambushed by a violent and powerful drug cartel in the jungle which resulted in the death of one of their men. The bad part is it was an inside job. Things come back to haunt the remaining members of the team in book one and just continue into the second. Book two is following a new couple. Sport and Danny.

Sport is given a hush hush assignment out of the blue. Being loaned out for solo ops isn't out of the norm for Sport, but something is off about this one. He's sent to watch and gather information on a person of interest, Danny O' Sullivan. Their first meeting is in an alley watching each other get off with twinks. The second is when Danny busts Sport rummaging through his private office. They butt heads right away, but they also feel the spark of lust between them. When Danny starts suggesting that the man from his agency who sent Sport to watch him may have much more sinister plans it tickles his gut feeling that something isn't right. This book was a lot better than the first one for a number of reasons. The fact that it was longer really helped and i felt that the characters were able to shine more, and that the story was able to grow more. It was action packed, fast paced at times as well as emotional, and i loved the fact that in this we find out what happened to Rodriguez from book one too.

Sigh.....Sport and Danny. Where to start with this complex, and stubborn pair. So we met Sport in book 1 and know that he was on the mission with Jackson which went wrong, and we also know that just like Jackson he also suffers from some PTSD (nightmares, flashbacks etc). When he's called in by his boss, Arthurs, to follow someone who is claimed to know about and have been involved in the mission which injured Jackson something feels "off" to Sport but he doesn't know what or why. Danny is the guy he's sent to watch and

gather intel on but Danny's not all he seems to be and has information for Sport, ABOUT Sport that spooks him putting him on an even higher alert. Little does he know that Danny's been expecting him and know who sent him and why. This leads to some major problems as Sport finds it hard to trust Danny due to what he's been told about him. After the action-packed intensity of book one in the series, I thought I'd be prepared for the sequel. But even though I sort of knew what I was in for, the characters, tension, and increasing threats lurking in the background still got to me. All the undercover and black ops shenanigans, not knowing whom to trust, and having two more good men caught up in it all certainly made for good reading. Jackson and Addy from book one are back, which I loved, but the focus is on Sport, an ex-SEAL and one of Jackson's team mates, and Danny, a secretive operative working for an "unidentified agency" who seems overly knowledgeable about the situation that started it all: the SEALs losing a team member during a mission in the jungle due to treason by someone high up in the government working with a drug lord.

Sport used to be a SEAL, working with Jackson, and now that he's looking for a quieter life, has a position with the FBI. He tries to do the right thing, and for a while the nightmares and occasional flashbacks are the only reminders of who he used to be. But coming to Jackson's aid when the man was about to be assassinated by an unidentified enemy seems to have forces in motion that might just destroy him after all. Whoever was after them in the jungle has not given up and they are still in danger. Suddenly the "quiet job" at the FBI vanishes, never to be seen again, and Sport finds himself in the thick of the action, manipulated and seduced by Danny—who is temptation personified. Eventually, he has to face the fact that he is vulnerable and as human as the next guy. Not easy for a tough SEAL like him!

Danny is after the government officials who are working for the drug lords. He has his own reasons, which he cannot disclose, so he hides behind one of his many personas when he tried to get Sport to help him not only bring down the immediate culprits, but the even higher-ups he knows to be pulling their strings. So deep in hiding he cannot even remember who he really is on some days, Danny has his own issues with the past and no reason to expect Sport to trust him. He still wants him though, even if he cannot admit how much or why.

If you like stories about wounded heroes who won't admit in how much need of psychological support and love they are, if you enjoy reading about an ex-SEAL who desperately tries to avoid falling for a manipulative spook, and if you're looking for an emotional, action-filled story with as many twists and turns as you'd expect from an action thriller, then you will probably like this novel.

Oh, I was *so* excited to see this book come out, the second in the Unexpected series by Silvia Violet about a group of Navy SEALS who *physically* survived an ambush during a overseas mission, but who are now psychologically traumatized by the events that killed one of their teammates. I loved the first book Unexpected Rescue and gave it 5 stars and put it on my favorites shelf, but while I enjoyed the second book, Unexpected Trust, it didn't dazzle me like the first one did.

Unexpected Trust tells the story of retired Navy SEAL and current FBI Agent MC Hugh "Sport" Cranford. He is assigned to a super-duper-top-secret mission that his FBI handler is not even briefed about and sent off on his own. His mission is to watch and make a connection between known spy MC Danny O'Sullivan and one of the men known to have orchestrated the ambush on his SEAL team many years ago. It turns out Danny has taken an interest in Sport's work as an FBI Agent and knows he is coming and the sexual tension starts from the moment these men make eye contact. And, damn if they aren't hot as Hades together! But I had a hard time understanding just where these two were coming from and where they where they were eventually going. It made for some impersonal sex for me, which I don't really care for, hot or not. \*shrugs\*

I read this one in one sitting, late at night, so I lost part of the spy/military/FBI/CIA story towards the end. I'm telling you that because I think the fault was mine, not Ms. Violet's. I couldn't put this one down! I needed a resolution to Sport and Danny's relationship before I could sleep so my groggy brain failed me.
