When selecting a picture book to purchase, what do you look for?

Attractive illustrations that will hold the attention of your child as you read to your child at bedtime. Gentle words that reinforce your constant love for your child and allow your child to fall asleep secure in the knowledge that he or she is truly loved by you. And after reading a bedtime story to your child, how pleasant to hear from your son or daughter "I love you". That is what I Love You Too, I Love You Three accomplishes.

What makes I Love You Too, I Love You Three different from other children's books?

This book is a way for parents and children to cement the bond of love between them. It rhymes, it includes the numbers 1 through 10. The words "I Love You" are repeated 15 times throughout the book. The book can be read interactively...the parent can read "I love you one" and the child replies "I love you two" and then the parent reads the next line "And now I say 'goodnight' to you" ... and on it goes...alternating the reading with the child being involved in the reading. Moms have given me feedback, after they read the book to their children, and have told me it results in their children spontaneously repeating "I love you...mom...dad...1, 2, 3...". Who doesn't want that?
