It has all the components I enjoy:

It is a suspense/thriller, without much gore. It had me rushing through the pages to find out what was going to happen next.

"... religion, rules, and regulations, they're a hundred times easier to follow than God's love. Nice and neat, no mess. No risks... and no real need to listen to His heart. p. 190

... Christ didn't come to condemn the lost, but to save them. p. 190

As far as I know, the only ones He ever condemned were the religious folks who claimed to be so righteous. p. 190

His guilt leads him to question what might be waiting for her after death, and he seeks out an organization that has been scientifically recording the experiences of souls once they leave the body. His questions draw the attention of another part of the same company working on life extension, for those who can afford it.
