Hercule Poirot and Captain Hastings get involved in another mystery when they are called upon by a Miss Marie Marvell. She has received threatening letters from someone who wants her necklace, thus named the Western Star. Her husband, Gregory Rolf, bought her the necklace three years ago. The pair are due to visit the Yardly's, at Yardly Chase, but Miss Marie won't leave her necklace with Poirot for safekeeping because she wants to show Lady Yardly, who has a similar necklace, named the Eastern Star. When Captain Hastings finds out that Lady Yardly has received similar letters he instructs Poirot that they must go down to Yardly Chase to "save the day". However, before they can stop them, both diamonds are stolen, and Poirot and Hastings are left wondering who stole them.

The Adventure of the Western Star is the very first Agatha Christie short story and was published in 1923. It features Hercule Poirot and Captain Hastings, and whilst there is no murder there is a fabulous mystery to be solved. A mystery surrounding two diamonds!!

At the time of publication, Agatha Christie had already published two full-length novels with Hercule Poirot and Captain Hastings (The Mysterious Affair at Styles and Murder on the Links) and it is clear from this short story that she was really getting into her stride with these two characters. I love the friendship between them, and quite possibly they may be the first "frenemies" since Captain Hastings has a love/hate relationship with Hercule Poirot. The heated discussion between Poirot and Hastings absolutely made this story for me. No matter how many of their stories I read I never get tired of this pair.

The mystery itself was great quality, and for a short story it was very intricate.

I listened to this one on audio, and at 46 mins long it was a short, fun listen. I really recommend the audiobooks of the short stories. They are quick listens, and the narrators are outstanding.

All in all another great Agatha Christie to add to the list, and I can't wait to pick up the next short story.

**My Review:** Again, a 99¢ Kindle Single as well as an episode of *Agatha Christie's Poirot's* second season.

Good lord, society was racist in those days. In 1923, when this story was published, making the villain

Chinese was a piece of shorthand for morally degenerate furriner. That the ultimate culprits were not Chinese and that the reason for the jewel theft was simple and sordid adultery made the entire tale predictable. This was more of a Columbo episode than it was a typical Christie.

The look of these shows is stellar. I love it, this Art Deco beauty and lushness. What's very strange to me is how much the atmosphere of the stories (in these early seasons) depends on Poirot and Hastings acting like an old married couple. Bicker bicker bicker! Smile and make up. Bicker some more, Poirot says something cutting, Hastings acts hurt, smile and make up! It was 1990 when these were made, no one can convince me that there's any chance of this being unconscious or accidental.

Well anyway it's a charming way to pass an hour.
