The story picks up immediately with Summer on the run from her shady and possibly murderous ex, Jack. After her father's death, Summer learns her father hid a ledger that contains damning evidence that her ex, Jack desperately wants. Running to her family vacation home as a last ditch effort to find the mysterious ledger, Summer bumps into her childhood crush, Sean. And this time, their attraction is even harder to fight.

Sean recognizes Summer as soon as he lays eyes on her. When they were younger, their two year age difference seemed insurmountable but now, now things are completely different. He knows something is up with Summer, especially since she's pretending to be someone else and something tells him, whatever she's hiding could be dangerous.

While they give into their explosive attraction, Sean fights to win Summer's trust and Summer tries to keep things casual with Sean. Not wanting to burden Sean with her issued, especially with him taking on his late father's struggling construction company, Summer knows this is the worst time to distract him. But when trouble follows her to Blue Bay, Summer will have to find out if she's ready to rely on someone else for a change.

Cathryn Fox knows how to write a sweet and smoking hot story, she keeps things short, simple and pretty

low angst.

What I liked:

Sean was an amazing H, he was sweet, understanding, supportive and just a really great guy. He was dealing with some heavy guilt over his father's passing but I loved how close he was to his brothers and cousins. I liked that he was so protective, not only of his family and his Gram but especially of Summer. Even without all the details, he always puts her first.

Summer was a funny and sweet h, but she had a bit of a martyr complex.

Add Demolished to your TBR list right now! Book 1 of a new series from Cathryn Fox, one of my favorite storytellers has brought us yet another set of drool worthy, lip smacking good, bad boy brothers and a couple of cousins who live in the tiny seaside town of Blue Bay, Connecticut. Onto the show.

The story starts with Summer on the run from Jack, her ex running into Sean Owen, the oldest of the brothers and the ultimate bad boy who left home to join the world of Motocross. He's basically retired due to so many injuries and is on his way back to Blue Bay, summoned by his Gram as were the rest of the boys because their Dad has died. Someone needs to step up and run the family business. Like Sean, all the boys left home and their heavy handed father when they were of age. Summer's parents owned a cottage in Blue Bay and while her Dad was at sea, she and her Mother would stay there for the summers. It's there she met Sean. At 14 years old, she had a serious crush on the boy who was a bit older than her. Summer is running, the death of her father 6 months earlier, overhearing a phone conversation with her live in that he'll get the ledger that her father hid by any means necessary and that has Summer, now a chiropractor cancelling appointments, grabbing a lock box she found and a couple of keys and making a beeline to the place no one would look for her. After her mother died there, she and her father boarded up the cottage and never went back. That was 13 years ago.

She meets Sean at a dingy diner in some small town and they have a steaming one night stand. She flees in the morning. She denies who she is, even though he knows it's her.

When she arrives in Blue Bay the cottage is in disrepair but doable and she needs to hire some help to make the necessary repairs. Going into town for groceries she's in the checkout line and who walks in, but Sean. Surprised to see her there, she's got fake ID her dad had made for her in case she needed it. So she pushes that name on him, even though he knows. When she learns that he'll be fixing the house up for her, things heat up quick. This book overflows with steamy scenes and there isn't a place that's off limits including front

yards and closets at her job. Must be the sea air that gives this guy his drive because he's definitely got lead in his pencil.

Not much has changed in town, the town cop still has it in for Sean and all the brothers, making his life miserable. Summer gets a job waitressing at an eatery in town and Gram has her over for Sunday dinner. The ice cream shop is still there and the cottage is packed with memories for Summer. Sean knows that Summer is hiding something from him, it bothers him that she doesn't trust him enough to share and her angle is she doesn't want to endanger him and his family. She slowly tells him things, but he never gets the whole story from her. Makes him angry but he doesn't press her.

After his fathers memorial service, couple things pass between the two and when he wakes up in the morning she's gone. He thinks maybe she's gone to work but his radar tells him different. Sean Owens couldn't get out of Blue Bay, Connecticut fast enough when he turned eighteen. His father was more than tough on Sean and his brothers and he felt like he was never good enough. Over the thirteen years he'd been gone, he became a motocross star. Sean's father has unexpectedly passed away so now Sean is coming back to Blue Bay. He left as the town bad boy. Now, all these years later, he wants to do right by his father and salvage his construction business. He wants to be the man his father wanted him to be. Will this small town give him a chance to prove he's not that teenage wild card anymore?

Summer Wheeler lives in Southern California and has a successful chiropractic practice. She recently lost her father in an accident. She suspects, though, that it wasn't really an accident. Then she overhears her boyfriend's telephone conversation. He's looking for something he thinks Summer has, and he's willing to do anything to get it. So Summer runs.

With nowhere else to go, Summer goes back to Blue Bay where her family has a cottage on the beach. She uses an alias, Jenna Garridy, so her now ex-boyfriend can't find her. The last stop before reaching Blue Bay, a cheap hotel and diner, Summer can't believe who walks in, the boy she crushed on when she was a young girl in Blue Bay, Sean Owens. Only he's all grown up now and wow did he grow up.

Sean couldn't believe it when he walked in to that diner. There sat Summer Wheeler. He was older than her when he was a teenager so she was off limits then but he had a huge crush on her. Now the age difference won't matter anymore.

This is a rather tough one to write. I requested for the book because I do like romantic suspense and it did appear as though Cathrynn Fox was starting a series with just that....so I was sold.

But it was disappointing to find 'Demolished' more sex than plot, and that's something that I think you've got to have your eyes open to before you get into any of Fox's stories. Her characters live and breathe sex, with every seemingly innocent action capable of stirring arousal and making each other sex-crazed at any given time of the day, no matter how inappropriate it can get. There's always heat and passion and many times the characters can't help themselves (especially the men who are never the one-woman sort until the heroine comes along), and that typically takes priority over any suspense or mystery that Fox does try to write into the story.

Sean and Summer go straight into a one night stand after a quick meeting at a bar, and banking on the idea that she has been away a long time, tries to slip into someone else's identity just as she tries to investigate what exactly went wrong with her father. This was the bit I couldn't get over; it seemed astoundingly stupid though and unbelievable that she was able to continue pretending she was someone else when it was clear this delusion was pretty much in her own head, especially after Sean recognised her early on yet went on with that ridiculous charade. This pretence continued for a long time, as did the sleeping together, and Summer pretty much ended up with egg on her face when the game was up.

In short, I did come into the story knowing this, yet I found myself getting tired of reading about Sean/Summer getting it on on every available surface. I did want to know what sort of mystery Summer

would uncover, which was only revealed towards the very abrupt end. Unfortunately, I lost interest past the halfway mark and I skimmed the rest just to find out what happened to Summer's ledger and the clues her father left her.

'Demolished', sad to say, was more of a miss for me and if the rest of the books are going to be written in a similar vein, I'll probably not continue this series at all.

Author Cathryn Fox gives two people who grew up wanting one another a chance for happiness when they are reunited 14 years later in *Demolished*. With a sexy, swoon worthy "bad boy" hero who is really a nice guy, a heroine on the run, and a small town filled with interesting characters, the Blue Bay Crew series is off to an entertaining start.

Summer Wheeler is on the run from her ex-boyfriend who she knows is planning to hurt her, in fact she thinks he might have been involved with her father's death. With a bunch of cash and cards for a new identity left by her father, Summer is returning home to her home town of Blue Bay hoping the 14 years she's been away and her new appearance will make everyone forget Summer and embrace her as Jenna.

Sean Owens returns to Blue Bay after the death of his father with his brothers and cousins on the way back as well to take over his father's construction company. Sean and his father had a difficult relationship and he feels guilty for not returning sooner. He made a name for himself on the professional motocross circuit, but now it is time for family and duty. What Sean doesn't expect is to run into Summer Wheeler on his way into town, the girl, now woman, who was off limits to his bad boy teenage self and he certainly doesn't expect what happens next.

I'm going to be real honest here, the whole new identity thread of the story drove me nuts, she fooled no one but they all let her be "Jenna" without calling her on it, I wanted to be that woman who walked up to her and said, "Look, we don't know what's going on, but you aren't fooling anyone Summer so just cut the cr*p and tell us what the hell is going on because you look like a damn fool." But, we didn't get that we watched Summer lie to everyone and behind her back everyone is winking and nodding because they know she isn't Jenna. This part of the story turned me off, completely so I know you are wondering why I gave this book 4 stars and that's because the history between Summer and Sean was compelling, the chemistry between them when they reunite is sizzling, the feelings that develop (or continue) between them are sweet, and these are two easy to like characters.
