A little conflicted over this one. I wanted to really love it, but I didn't. It was good and a very good size for an eBook. My issues are personal opinions. It was well written and the characters really were developed and brought to life.

Knox was too cruel. I get that the author wanted there to be strife and conflict between him and Amanda, but I just think it went overboard. I would never have forgiven him for some of the things he said and did. He would only call me a whore once and never see me again. It wasn't just his hurtful words but his entire attitude. Knox had a problem falling/being love and took his confusion and pain out on Amanda. It wasn't until after the final straw for Amanda and she left that he came to accept that he wanted her. I don't think there was enough remorse or groveling from Knox for Amanda to take him back.

I loved Jace. He truly loved Amanda and treated her accordingly. He was there for her emotionally and tried to build her up not down. My only issue is that he didn't beat the shit out of Knox enough.

Cody is the baby brother and his personality showed it. He was all about fun and getting what he wanted. He devastates Amanda with his obsessive loyalty to another woman. Cody also says something that degrades Amanda and shows his immaturity in a public setting. He truly felt horrible for his actions, but it was more than Amanda could take. It took him awhile to admit to himself and a little longer for him to tell Amanda that he loved her.

Amanda is a woman with some self-worth issues. I felt as if she was too confrontational to hide insecurities. Sometimes, Amanda would be antagonistic to a fault and then get all hurt when the reaction she gets is appropriate. Then she takes more, of what I would consider hateful and borderline abusive, than anyone ever should from the brothers, especially Knox. Amanda does eventually leave the brothers due to their behavior, but this was after she went back and forth a few times. It took her a bit, but Amanda gets some backbone and stands up for herself.

Maybe it was a little too long. The relationship between the brothers and Amanda seemed to take a circular route and too long to develop into something loving and healthy for it got a little aggravating. It ends with more of a HFN then a HEA. It feels like the story should continue with the next book, not a conclusive ending.

Those who enjoy reading about heroines and heroes with bad tempers, lots of conflict, and dubious-consent ménage sex may enjoy the *Kansas Heat* series.

There are things I like about *Kansas Heat* and things I really don't like about it, which made it difficult to rate. Only one of the four main characters in this ménage a quatre romance is very likable, in my opinion.

Like - Jace Reese, a cattle rancher, has some maturity and empathy that makes him good relationship material.

Don't like - Cody, and Knox (Jace's brothers) and Amanda Johnson are immature and all have hair trigger tempers. The vast majority of the 400+ page book is consumed with Amanda, Cody, and/or Knox goading one another into squabbles. The resulting rage then fuels their lust and usually results in Amanda being forced into bed, where the brothers use sex to control her. It is explicitly stated that Amanda really wants to be controlled and that it turns her on.

When Amanda meets the Reese brothers early in the story (first Cody, then Jace and Knox), they almost immediately expect her to submit to their sexual domination, including force; but there is no prior relationship to establish trust. Most of the time Cody and Knox are very emotionally abusive to Amanda, and that is always excused by them giving her lots of orgasms (as Cody and Knox assert during arguments)!

Like - As much as I did not like so much bickering, some of the sex scenes are very well written, and there are a lot of them.

Don't like - There is a plot about danger to Amanda because of some missing drug cartel money that makes a relatively brief appearance at the beginning and near the end of the book. The suspense plot is glaringly absent for most of the story, and I wonder if it was added as an afterthought.

I took a quick look at the sequel, *Kansas Nights*, and the characters seem equally conflict driven (annoying), so I will not be continuing with this series.
