This is my first "clean read." Clean reads are challenging because authors need to bring the passion, emotions, and feelings without the elements of erotica.

This book fell flat for me, unfortunately.

I liked the setting and I liked most of the characters and I liked the main plot but what I didn't like, or rather WHO I didn't like, was the heroine.

I never believed that either her first husband or Drew, the hero of this book, were her soulmate. From her perspective, I felt like they worked for her because they were comfortable and they fit into her view of how things should be.

I also found her a bit unforgiving, bratty, and petulant. Although it is understandable that she would have reservations due to her being a widowed single mother, her treatment of Drew was less than stellar when he was trying to do everything he could to make her life a little easier, a little better. He went out of his way to show her he loved her long before he said it. Her explanation of why she was cut off from her entire family was hollow, too.

I will be giving the author's other books a try in spite of not caring much for this one.

So he loads flowers and people into his truck and brings them into town. As he is driving he finds out this little girl is the one he delivered 10 years ago. He becomes attracted to her mother who is now a widow. You need to read the book to find out what happens between these two or three. Quite a page turner.

I give this story something between a 3.5 and a 4. I enjoyed it while reading, finished, moved on and sort of forgot about it.
