He is extremely nervous, and the man he is sharing space with is one of the best around. He really doesn't want to disappoint. His best friends Gene and Dan talk him into going out for dinner and some shopping. When Brent comes across an old record album with a naked woman covered in whipped cream, he immediately knows what he wants to do for his Pièce de résistance. Now, he only needs to find the right man who can pull off what he sees in his mind. Dan and Gene are sure they can help with his search and asks him to accompany them to their gym the next day to scope out the other guys and see if there is anyone that meets all of his requirements. Brent really didn't expect to find anyone but when he comes across Tristan Greer, he knows immediately that he's the man for the job. He gives Tristan his card and asks him to stop by and look at some of his work before he makes a decision.

When Tristan shows up to have a look at Brent's work, more goes on between them then just taking photos. Before anything could be discussed Tristan gets a call and has to leave. When Brent doesn't hear from him for a few days he starts to wonder if his looks are more important to Tristan then he thought. You see, eighteen months ago Brent was involved in a gay-bashing. He was scarred on his face and he believes that anytime anyone looks at him, all they see are his scars, but that's not the case at all. Tristan has some issues of his own and when his sister needs him, he will always be there for her, like she was for him. Tristan may look perfect on the outside but that doesn't mean he doesn't have scars of his own on the inside.

Brent enlists his friends to help him and Tristan get ready to shoot his Whipped Cream theme portrait and when it's all done, Brent knows not only does he have a winning photo but he has been won over by Tristan.

This was a very cute story. I wish it wouldn't have been so short. 100 pages is just not enough of these two men for my liking. I wouldn't mind another story from Tristan's POV. *hint hint*

Rolling along in the Work Out series, we meet up with Brent, a former model whose face was slightly disfigured in a gay bashing and who now works as a portrait photographer in the Pennsylvania community where the series takes place. He needs to come up with a smashing idea to play equal with a narcissistic pain in the neck competitor at an upcoming exhibit, and his friends Gabe and Dan, from the first book in the series, assist him in finding a potential model for the idea Brent has come up with--Tristan, the man on the cover in whipped cream shorts.

This is an adorable, sometimes funny, often heart-tugging novella which you will love. It's not necessary to read the rest of the books in the series because they are all basically standalones but take place in the same town and have ties to the gym everyone goes to. Enjoy it, and bring some cherries.

Although this is not being billed as another story in the Workout Series, it really could be. All of the main secondary characters have appeared in the author's workout series books.

In this story, Brent is a photographer and has a big show coming up -- in fact, it is his first real show. He has a lot of terrific male nudes, but there is no specular piece that the audience will be drawn to. He is looking for an inspiration, and he finds it on an old record cover. One thing though, just like the album cover, the model that he is going to use for the photo shoot has to wear only whipped cream as his whole outfit.

Brent goes to the gym (with some of the guys from the workout series) to look for a willing model, and he meets Tristan. Well . . . Tristan is gorgeous and Brent has facial scarring, and there is a lot of "I don't deserve him" in is book.

Tristan become Brent's model, and there is an insta-love relationship with long-lasting professions of love after their first time hitting the sheets. After "it" is over, Brent leaves and promises to call but he doesn't for days. Then some formula writing . . . angst, angst, angst, blah, blah, blah . . .

But, I digress. There is a photography show in Philadelphia that is a great success, and we are left to believe (as in every Andrew Grey book) that the two main characters will live happily ever after.

I like Andrew Grey's writing, but it is getting a little too much like a formula -- the cautious beginning (with self-deprecation) for about 30 pages, the "meeting" of the two main characters for about 20 pages, the "courting" for another 20 pages, the "conflict" for another 20 pages, and then then the 15 page happily ever after. (All of which has interspersed sex scenes every 15 pages.). After 30+ books, its getting a little old.

Just like the picture on the cover, at first glance, this book is about having a bit of naughty fun. It made me smile and it made me laugh, but that was just the surface. What can be found underneath is a story about two wonderful characters who have been through a lot of pain, only to discover that life can still be fun when they find each other. And, in the end, it is this depth of characterization and emotions that really caught me and swept me away into a world that is so much better when filled with love.

Brent has been dealt a heavy blow and could have crawled away never to be seen again, but he doesn't. He picks up the pieces of his life and makes a new one: he becomes a photographer. The invitation to do his first exhibition at an art gallery, alongside a well-known photographer, comes as a surprise. It's a little scary, and Brent needs some sort of idea to make it all hang together. Luckily, inspiration strikes, and his friends help him find the model.

Tristan is a student trying to make ends meet. His family rejected him when he came out, and only his sister still talks to him. He's somewhat hesitant about being a model at first, but as soon as he gets to know Brent a little better, his enthusiasm grows by leaps and bounds, and he does his best to help him out. His involvement soon outgrows a professional relationship and the real fun starts.

If you like stories that look deceptively simple at first glance, but end up pulling you in as you peel away the layers and discover the more serious message of hope underneath, if you enjoy a bit of cheeky humor and a conceited villain, and if you're looking for a story that will make you sigh as the characters find each other and smile because they're just so much fun together, then you will probably like this novella as much as I did.
